The information below gives an outline of what the children will be learning this term. PE will be on a Tuesday and Friday this term, so please ensure that full kits - including a spare pair of shoes - are in school on those days.

English

Spellings

Endings which sound like /ʃəs/ spelt **-cious** or **-tious**; Maths vocabulary; endings which sound like /ʃəl/**cial**; endings which sound like /ʃəl/**tial**; homophones; Words from the year 5/6 spelling list.

Writing

Newspaper report; instructions; diary entry; formal speech; setting description; thriller writing.

Reading

Information retrieval; inference and deduction; use of language; word meaning; summarizing and prediction.

Drama

Freeze frames; debate; role play; empathy and listening.

Maths

Fractions: finding equivalence; comparing and ordering fractions; add and subtract fractions, including mixed numbers; multiply fractions by fractions; multiply and divide fractions by integers; fraction of amounts; solve problems with fractions.

Converting Measure: convert metric measures; miles and kilometres; imperial measures.

Science

Evolution and inheritance: Recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago; Recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents; Identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution

Music: Dynamics, pitch and tempo: theme - Fingal's Cave.

History: Wars and battles from 1066 to 1485 (**continued**).

Geography: Comparative Study: UK, Europe and North America (World & UK Map)

French: Notre monde - the world around us.

PE: Hockey and gymnastics.

DT: Cooking and nutrition.

PSHE: Keeping safe: value - responsibility.
