In the Summer holidays, there was an update by the DFE regarding Penalty Notices and authorising absence. The document in its entirety can be found here:

In this document it makes it very clear that term time absence can only be authorised in exceptional circumstances and that term time holidays are <u>not</u> considered to be an exceptional circumstance. Headteachers are therefore unable to authorise term time holidays.

The new guidance then instructs schools that "Please be aware that any 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period will then be considered for a Penalty Notice as well as 5 consecutive days of unauthorised term time absence."

We are duty bound to follow these new rules as are all schools in England and Wales. Attendance and how it is dealt with form part of the Ofsted inspection framework and we are held accountable for it.

We do not seek to issue fines and we certainly don't want to see our families reach the point of facing prosecution. We ask that you please work with us and do not book holidays during term time.

Lastly, congratulations to our year 6 children who completed the Kent Tests at school yesterday. You all conducted yourself so well. I hope that your hard work and preparation pays off and know that whatever the outcome, we are proud of you.
