We hope you have had a good week! All classes had a workshop with Chris Knott from Starfish Malawi on Wednesday. As ever, we are grateful to him for coming in and raising awareness of

the work he does and the charity. We will continue to support this project at Ightham.

On Monday, Year 1 spent time practising their cutting skills for DT. They looked at how to be safe using a knife and fork and how to handle food with clean hands. Year 1 were wonderful and especially careful when cutting their fruit into small pieces. Well done Year 1!

Year 2 had their first Forest School session this week and the children had a wonderful time. They created frames from large sticks and produced a piece of art work using exciting finds from the forest. Some children even made reindeer Christmas decorations by cutting and joining sticks from the forest floor. They had great fun on the huge swing and as the weather was so nice, they were able to safely climb the trees too.

This week, Year 5 have focused on this year's theme of 'Choose Respect' for Anti-Bullying week. The children have all fully engaged in discussion around the theme and worked in pairs to create posters demonstrating their understanding of 'respect' and 'disrespect'. They also used role play to act out different scenarios and consider the impact of them.

Children started the week exploring conflict resolution tools as part Anti-Bullying week in Year 6. They had their first hockey session of the week on Wednesday afternoon and enjoyed

Ukulele playing is coming along really well, children are looking forward to being able to show their hard work to everyone at the Christmas concert.

This week Acorn Class began their new topic, 'Once Upon a Time' with a visit from 'Postlady Snow' (sadly, no photographic evidence!) There was a special parcel for Acorn Class on Monday morning. Inside was a letter from 'The Jolly Postman' as well as a copy of his very special book 'The Jolly Postman by Janet and Allan Ahlberg.' Children have very much enjoyed reading the story and being introduced to all the characters and settings. The children have loved their new Post Office role play area too. They are all enjoying making parcels and letters, visiting the Post Office to get stamps and then being the postman on his bike delivering the post to the different book characters post boxes in the playground. It's wonderful to see them all working as a team in the sorting office!
