Dear Parents & Carers,

Ightham School has kept learning in this final week of Autumn Term 1 (even though we are all very tired in Week 8!). The highlight for me was definitely our poetry assembly where each class performed a poem. Children performed with such enthusiasm, confidence and clarity. It really was a fantastic event to end the term.

In Acorn Class, children haven't stopped talking about... pumpkins! They have completed lots of maths activities, including measuring and ordering pumpkins. They have also enjoyed playing on the pumpkin patch as well as scooping our pumpkins out to make pumpkin soup. There were also explosions when they mixed baking soda with vinegar in our cauldron pumpkins. (I wonder who had to clean up all the mess...?)

Pine Class had their last week of Forest School for a little while. In celebration of this, children lit a fire and toasted marshamallows to make smores. They tasted really yummy!

Elm Class have been finishing off the last part of addition and subtraction in their maths lessons. They have been writing fact families and answering problem solving and reasoning questions to greater understand the aspects of the calculation to look at in a written question. In Geography, they have been looking at how to use grid referencing to read maps, identifying and plotting points on a map. This will hopefully come in very handy over the next month when they go on their trip to Chart Farm. They also had a great Tag Rugby session this week, where the children showed excellent team behaviour.

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In Oak class this week, they have focused their study on religious education. The key question that was explored was: What difference does it make to believe in Ahimsa, Grace and Ummah? They considered what the word "commitment" means and reflected on the commitments we make in our life before learning how Christians, Muslims and Ghandi displayed commitment to their beliefs. They took this further by considering how we could apply a sense of community, harmlessness and the ability to forgive to our own lives.

Beech Class took part in the first Community Afternoon of the year. It was a wonderful event with a delightful atmosphere. The children and adults they had invited all enjoyed talking and playing board games, with the occasional 'would you rather' thrown in - a very interesting discussion was had over whether you'd rather sweat sticky lemonade or have your breath smell of garlic! Thank you very much to those adults who joined us, Mrs Freeman & Mrs Webster who provided refreshments, Ms Glassock for organising and the children who were a credit to the school with their behaviour.


