Bach to the Future

Mrs Warnes, our Music Leader, has booked a Music Company to come to Ightham for all of Key Stage 2 on the first day after half term. The production is called Bach to the Future and is an hour long interactive workshop which aims to inspire students to learn a musical instrument and should encourage them to have an understanding of how valuable music is in our everyday lives. Three experienced musicians will each represent an instrument family - Colin on Brass, Lori on Strings and Graeme on Woodwind - and treat students to live demonstrations of music from film, TV and musical theatre, and a range of different styles of music from classical and jazz to popular music. The musicians play a variety of instruments and show a range of musical pieces. They will also demonstrate instruments that can be made at home.

A25 Footpath

A number of parents and staff have raised concerns with me recently that there are an increasing number of children and parents that are not using the bridge over the A25 and are choosing to walk across the A25 instead. I strongly urge all our parents and children to utilise the footbridge as it is there for a reason.
